7. Read Galatians 5:1. Jesus fulfilled the law on the cross and now the grace of God has set us free. Do you ever struggle with your freedom in Christ?
8. Our natural tendency is to take that freedom and use it selfishly for our self. That it's my life and it's my body and I can decide what's best for me. But God has a much better plan for us. Read Galatians 5:13
9. I'm so thankful that The Church at Argyle is a church of grace, a church of love, a church of acceptance. But don't confuse that with thinking that you can live however you decide to live. What does that mean to you?
10. The Galatians were worried about keeping the law. They were worried about being good enough. There were over 600 laws in the Old Testament. Read Galatians 5:14 How can we do that?
11. You're free and you don't have to do things God's way. But when we choose to ignore God's instruction and we do things our own way, there is always a consequence. Read Galatians 5:15
